## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

## Dear parents

Last week the school celebrated the Trimester One Presentation Assembly. I was impressed by the standards attained by our students and pleased with the number of parents who attended to share in their children's success. All trimester 1 reports have now been issued and if you have not received one then you need to contact the school.



I am concerned about the escalating amount of face book gossip that is surfacing within the Forbes community. I use the term gossip as that is what it is with minimal connections to the truth. Unfortunately some people choose to believe some of the rubbish that is communicated in this forum. I cannot control the spread of this but can assure you that it is being monitored and would like to advise all parents that if the gossip can be connected to specific persons, then consequences including school suspensions, expulsions or litigation may result if seen as an appropriate course of action. As parents I hope that you are closely monitoring your child whist they access the relevant technologies at home. As students can also access face book via mobile phones this is exacerbating the problem as less supervision regarding mobile phone use occurs. There is time when intervention from parents is essential as character assassination through the virtual world is a cowardly and pathetic avenue to address issues. Forbes High School intends to have the local police youth liaison officer present information sessions to selected groups on the appropriate use of social networking. Teachers and Police however, can only do so much but parents share a larger role in preventing unsubstantiated and often defamatory claims from being created or responded to. Virtual networking is a societal issue and cannot be solved by schools alone and requires all parties to be working together. The Department of Education has advised that mobile phones cannot be banned at school but obviously parents can play a controlling role intervening if their child persistently accesses face book inappropriately via their mobile phone.

As parents and teachers, I would hope we would all agree that learning to cope with the occasional compromise, correction and disappointment is a critical part of growing up and developing the necessary resilience to cope with the pressures of life. I know most parents would support what the school is doing. I cannot however sugar-coat my thoughts about a small group of parents who prematurely want to intervene and support their child regardless of the circumstance and without knowing all the facts. Constantly criticising the school for doing its job does not help the staff or help the child develop any long term emotional maturity and be better prepared to respond to adversity with resilience and respect. I would hope that the small group of parents that this message is directed towards take this on board. Less spin and more balanced support from such parents would help us achieve our shared objective.

# Recipe

## Sweet potato soup recipe

## Ingredients:

½ brown onion, peeled and diced 1 clove garlic, peeled and diced 2 cups Campbell's vegetable stock 400 g sweet potato, peeled and cubed ½ cup coconut cream 1 lime, juice




#### Method:

- 1. Heat an oiled heavy based saucepan over medium heat. Add onion and garlic and cook for 2-3 minutes.
- 2. Add stock and sweet potato to the saucepan, bring to the boil. Reduce to a simmer and cook for 6-8 minutes or until sweet potato is tender.
- 3. Blend in a food processor until smooth. Return to the saucepan over low heat and stir in coconut cream, lime juice and season well.
- 4. Ladle in a warm bowl to serve.

## **Broccoli Soup recipe**

## Ingredients:

1 tablespoon olive oil
1 small brown onion, chopped coarsely
1 small leek, sliced thinly
200g broccoli, cut into florets
11/2 cups (375ml) Campbell's beef stock
1/4 cup (60ml) Dairy Farmers pure cream
1 teaspoon finely chopped fresh chives



### Method:

- 1. Heat the oil in a medium saucepan; sauté onion and leek until vegetables soften. Add broccoli; sauté until broccoli is browned lightly. Add the stock; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, about 15 minutes or until broccoli is tender. Remove and reserve three broccoli florets.
- 2. Blend or process soup, in batches, until smooth; return to same, cleaned pan. Stir in cream; stir over low heat until heated through.
- 3. Serve broccoli soup with reserved broccoli florets; sprinkle with chives. Serve soup with a dollop of crème fraiche, if desired.
