PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Yearly exams and semester reports – we have commenced our program of yearly exams and assessments for 2012 and would like to wish our students all the best. Our end of semester reports draw up results from assessment tasks conducted throughout the semester but exams are an important component of our assessment schedules. They also provide students with the opportunity to develop important life skills. Importantly they also generally reward those students who have maintained a regular pattern of study and revision during the school year - helping to embed learning and understanding.

Attendance and completing Assessments – an important component of our PBL relates to doing your best. I am concerned with the number of times I am told of students who fail to complete assignments, homework and classwork. As well, I am concerned about the poor attendance of a small group of our students. Poor attendance and poor work ethic do not allow the school to determine satisfactory student's completion of a school year. If I find it necessary, then some students may have to repeat their current year. Advancement is not a given and it is a student's responsibility (supported by their parents) to show through work ethic, diligence and attendance that they are ready to move into the next year of learning.

Positive Behaviour for Learning Program (PBL) – One of our school goals is to provide students with explicit information and strategies so they can demonstrate successful and desirable behaviour. We have high expectations of our students and believe that by working to achieve greater consistency that, as a team, we will achieve better results and our focus can be directed to our core goal – improved educational outcomes, so students can realise their true potential. Our key themes are RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, HONESTY and DOING YOUR BEST. Aggressive behaviour does not have a place in a respectful school. Responsible students take pride in their learning and success. Participating as part of the Forbes High School team helps build a positive and energetic learning environment. PBL is a win-win concept and we are firmly committed to reducing incidents of inappropriate behaviour and attitude and increasing student engagement and responsibility for learning.

Laptops 2013 – The provision of laptops will cease at the end of 2013. The Commonwealth funded Digital Education Revolution Program funding will finish. We expect to receive approximately 75 laptops as part of the final distribution and it is intended that these laptops will **not** be allocated to Year 9 students but kept as resources for classroom use, to enhance technology usage across the school. The school staff feel that this will be a more efficient way of enriching exposure to modern technology.

Year 12 Farewell – Friday 23rd November, Forbes RSL. This is expected to be a great event and a fitting finale to our current Year 12. I look forward to sharing in this event with our students, parents and friends. I remind you all in advance, however that this is an alcohol free event.

A new Deputy Principal for Forbes High School – As you are all aware, Ms Stacey Kelly has now left the school and this has created a vacancy for a new Deputy Principal. This position will be filled in the next three weeks by interview and hopefully in the next newsletter I will be in a position to announce the successful candidate.

GAME REVIEW: ASSASSIN'S CREED III. BY JAKOB SMITH

Assassin's Creed III is a historical action-adventure open world stealth video game developed by Ubisoft Montreal and published by Ubisoft for Microsoft Windows. It is the fifth major instalment and the third numbered title in the Assassin's Creed series, and a direct sequel to 2011's Assassin's Creed: Revelations. The game was released worldwide for PlayStation 3 and Xbox 360, beginning in North America on October 30, 2012. A Wii and Microsoft Windows version will be released in November 2012.

Assassin's Creed III is set before, during and after the American Revolution from 1753 to 1783 featuring a new half English and half Mohawk also known by the adopted name of "Connor". In addition to the historical period, the game also features the "present day" setting, where series protagonist Desmond Miles must adventure to prevent the 2012 apocalypse, as his story develops and reaches a conclusion.
