NEW SCHOOL LEAVING AGE

As of January 2012, NSW has a new school leaving age, meaning students will complete Year 10 and then have a number of options in which to participate until at least age 17. What's New?

- 1. From 2012, all NSW students must complete Year 10.
- 2. After Year 10 and until the age of 17 student must be:
 - a. in school, or registered for home schooling OR
 - b. in approved, or registered for home schooling OR
 - c. in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hrs/week) OR
 - d. in a combination of these.

School Leaving Age FAQs

All students must complete Year 10. After Year 10 and until they turn 17, students must be:

- in school, or registered for home schooling, or
- in approved education or training (eg TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship) or
- in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hrs/week) or
- in a combination of work, education and/or training.
