#### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

It has been an industrious time for the staff and students of Forbes High School over the past month. It is extremely pleasing to see our students being given the opportunity to succeed and grow in a wide variety of forums relating to academics, sport, creative and performing arts and leadership. I believe as a school community we need to celebrate and promote these successes as models for what is achievable and below are examples of just that.

The exhibit at the Forbes Show proved to be an excellent opportunity for our students to showcase their talents and creativity to the wider community. In a testament to their application, effort and quality of work our exhibit was awarded the 'Best Indoor Commercial Exhibitors Award'. A special mention and thanks must be afforded to Anita Morrison for her efforts in coordinating the creation of the exhibit and to the staff who gave up their time over the two days to man the stall and interact positively with the community.

On August 29 a team of our students attended Corinella PS for the 'Kids Teaching Kids' conference as part of the 'Year of the Farmer' celebrations. Throughout the day the students undertook leadership roles assisting younger students, fulfilling catering duties and providing entertainment with a dance rendition. These students were tremendous ambassadors for the school and this opportunity further developed our links with our partner schools in the Lachlan Valley Community of Schools.

On the sporting field we had four students attend the NSW Combined High Schools athletics championships Darcie Morrison, Laura Herbert, Dylan Robb and Jess Pascoe. All students competed admirably and it is an achievement in itself to qualify for events at this level. Jess' performances in the 1500m and 800m need special mention and congratulations as she won gold and silver respectively.

In a time when the funding of public schools is being heavily scrutinised we have had some positive news. As a result of the completion of the Priority Schools Program surveys, which were completed earlier in the year, Forbes HS has been allocated Transitional Equity Funding. This means that we will receive a monetary and indicative staffing supplementation for 2013. These funds will be used to support our school plans, maximising opportunities to explore innovative practices that support continuous improvement in our students' achievement. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Ms Kelly and the P&C for their contributions in obtaining the funding and you, as parents, for making the commitment to complete the necessary surveys.

The HSC examinations are fast approaching and Year 12 will formally graduate from Forbes HS on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> September. I would like to sincerely wish all students the very best as they embark on life post-secondary schooling. As a school it is our commitment to provide students with the necessary skills to achieve their desired pathway and we hope that opportunities are taken with both hands. To the parents of our students we thank you for your support along the journey.

School holidays will commence from Monday 24th September and school will resume on Monday 8th October. There will be **no** Staff Development Day to start the term. The Staff Development Days will take place on the final two days of the school year. I wish all students and their families a safe and relaxing time.
