PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As we move into the second half of term 4 it is definitely an industrious time at Forbes High School. Year 11 students have officially begun their HSC studies whilst students in years 7-10 are completing their final weeks and assessments for semester two. As a result information is being gathered by teachers to complete comprehensive reports that provide an indication of students' strengthens and areas for improvement. Reports will be distributed on Friday 12th December which coincides with our Presentation Assembly. Our assembly will begin at 10am in the hall and I invite all family and friends of Forbes High School to attend and celebrate the achievements of our students.

Monday 3rd November marked a significant day in the history of the school as our NAIDOC Debating team were crowned the NSW State NAIDOC Challenge debating champions. After regional qualifying in Cowra and regional finals in Dubbo the team travelled to Sydney to compete at the state final. The team consisting of Danielle Jenkins, Nic Mulligan, Maddison Collits and Paige Thomas defeated Tempe HS in the final. Congratulations to the team and their coach Mr Swan on their achievements.

Year 12 participated in their final official school function on Saturday 8th November at the graduation dinner. The night was an opportunity for our students to celebrate with their family, friends and teachers and to reflect on their time at Forbes High School. I would like to thank Mrs Jones for leading the organisation of the event and for her ongoing support of the students as year advisor throughout their high school years.

On 30th August, 2012 Private Nathaneal Galagher was killed in action as part of the 2nd Commando Regiment in Afghanistan. Nathaneal attended Forbes HS from 2001 until 2006. An intimate commemoration with family, friends and teachers took place in the Judith Taylor Rose garden on Saturday 8th November to lay a plaque in celebration of Nathaneal. I would like to thank Mrs Sue Cunningham for the organisation of the plaque, along with the Forbes sub-branch of the RSL, and for the fitting service.

Once again Forbes HS will lead the way in raising community awareness around domestic violence with the organisation of and participation in the White Ribbon Day march. At 10.00am on Tuesday 25th November students and teachers will be joined by community members in marching from Cross Street to Victoria Park. The community will then participate in activities aimed at raising awareness around supporting victims of domestic violence and they will be entertained with musical items from our students. I would like to invite all family and friends of Forbes HS to join us on the day.



BOOK REVIEW: Redeeming Love

In her best seller, Francine Rivers tells a timeless story anew. The story takes place in the midst of a gold rush - California, 1835. Since before she was born, Angel has only ever been exploited in the world of men in which she lives – by the monster 'Duke,' her father, her step-father Rab, and every other man she has ever met. That is, until she meets Michael who offers to take her away from her unending misery. Michael, Angel's protector. Michael, who accepts her – and her past. Michael, who is in love with her. But is that enough to save her?

Soon Angel begins to feel unease. She is scared of what Michael is doing to her well-constructed barriers, which keep her emotions so safely tucked away from humanity. So she runs... anywhere without him. She soon falls lower than she has ever been before. And despite what she has done Michael once again brings her out of her tragic life. More and more problems weigh up against Angel, and her resilience is tested – as the detestable Duke returns for her.

Redeeming Love is truly the book that has it all – romance, history, cowboys, acceptance, romanticism, mystique, and life-long friendship. This is a journey of one woman's escape from both mental and physical oppression. It is a beautifully written book, with a breath-taking end.

NAIDOC DEBATING TEAM - BEST IN NSW

The Department of Education and Communities runs a public speaking and debating competition to celebrate NAIDOC. Forbes High School selected the following students to be a part of the team: Maddison Collits (1st speaker), Paige Thomas (2nd speaker), Danielle Jenkins (3rd speaker) and Nic Mulligan (Team Advisor).

The students had to prepare two arguments, one for the affirmative and one for the negative. They debated whether 'The Australian Government has properly recognised the contribution of Aboriginal service men and women during and after war time'. The students began their journey to success in Cowra. There, they placed as runners-up but earned themselves a place at the Western NSW finals held in Dubbo. When debating in Dubbo, the students beat Cowra High School (who had defeated us at the local level) and found themselves in the final against Denison College – Kelso High Campus. They won convincingly and sealed their position as a State finalist.

The students and Mr Swan travelled to Sydney on Sunday the 2nd of November. Upon arriving in the city, students took part in some Traditional Indigenous Games and had a barbeque in the beautiful Botanical Gardens. The students were not intimidated by the other schools 'scare tactics' and remained cool and calm throughout the evening.

Monday morning saw an early start at the Sydney Parliament House. They were pitted against Kanahooka High School from Wollongong. The team won the coin toss and the choice of which topic to argue, the students chose the negative case. They definitely had the audience on their side with the raw emotion and intellectual arguments they made. They won convincingly and earned themselves a place in the Grand Final against Tempe High School from Sydney, a partially selective academic high school approximately three times the size of Forbes High School.

Losing the coin toss, students were given the negative case to argue. Tempe proved tough competition, but the skill of the students saw them remain calm and they successfully swayed the audience and adjudicators to their case. The students were in complete shock and jubilation when they were announced as winners of the competition. They each received a trophy and a \$100 gift card. They also won a beautiful plaque set against the backdrop of an Aboriginal artwork, to be displayed at the school for 12 months.

The competition is designed for students in senior years, so it is even more credit to the students that they managed to win it, particularly with our students being in Year 7 (Paige Thomas), Year 9 (Maddison Collits and Nic Mulligan), and Year 10 (Danielle Jenkins). Unfortunately there is no national competition, but the students can be proud of their efforts. They have most certainly earned the bragging rights to say that they are the best NAIDOC debating team in all of NSW! Well done to the students. If they are able to achieve this at such a young age, you can only imagine what they will achieve in their lifetime. Keep your eye out for them in the future!
