Mrs Coote's Year 9/10 Food Technology class enjoyed their practical lesson recently cooking up Fresh Basil and Tomato Pasta. Yum!



#### Fresh Basil and Tomato Pasta Recipe

#### Ingredients:

375g fresh fettuccini

4 vine-ripened tomatoes, coarsely chopped 1/2 cup fresh basil, loosely packed, coarsely shredded

2 garlic cloves, crushed

2 tablespoons Aged Balsamic Vinegar 60ml (1/4 cup) Extra Virgin Olive Oil

Salt & freshly ground black pepper Shaved parmesan, to serve

#### Method:

- 1. Cook the pasta in a large saucepan of salted boiling water following packet direction or until al dente. Drain well.
- 2. Meanwhile, combine the tomato, basil, garlic, vinegar and half the oil in a large heatproof bowl. Taste and season with salt and pepper.
- **3**. Add the hot pasta to the tomato mixture and gently toss to combine.
- **4**. Spoon pasta among serving bowls. Drizzle with remaining oil and sprinkle with parmesan.

### FORBES HIGH MERINO'S DOMINATE AT DUBBO!

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August The Forbes High Show Team took five teams of Merino wethers to the 2016 School Wether Challenge at the National Merino Show and Sale.

The competition consisted of 44 teams, of a range of public and private schools from throughout N.S.W. The teams were judged over 2 days on their wool quality, carcase quality and their scores added together to calculate the overall most valuable teams. Forbes High school had 1 team from the Dunkley family in Forbes, 1 team from the Noakes family in Bedgerebong and 3 teams from the Kirk family in Condobolin.

All teams were judged with wool on and given a combined valuation, then shorn, muscle and fat scanned and judged on their carcase quality. All Values were then calculated together to determine the overall champion team.

Forbes High School had an extremely successful show.

The Dunkley team placed 1<sup>st</sup> in the combined valuation, 2<sup>nd</sup> in wool evaluation and 2<sup>nd</sup> in carcase valuation giving them the overall ranking of first in the fine wool class.

The top Kirk team placed 1<sup>st</sup> in combined evaluation, 2<sup>nd</sup> in wool and 2<sup>nd</sup> in carcase valuation placing them 1<sup>st</sup> in the medium to strong wool class. This team was then placed 1<sup>st</sup> overall as the top team of the show.

The Noakes team placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in carcase evaluation but finished with an overall ranking of 8<sup>th</sup>.

Our teams finished 1<sup>st</sup>,6<sup>th</sup> ,8<sup>th</sup>,14<sup>th</sup> in the medium/strong wool class, and 1<sup>st</sup> in the fine wool class.

This was an amazing achievement for Forbes High considering the calibre of the 40 plus opposition teams.



Mr Byrne and Mrs Eagles were extremely proud of the student's behaviour and effort across the 2 days. The results we have achieved at this show were great reward for all the hard work and dedication the show team had put into preparing the wethers for the event.

None of our achievements would be possible without the support of our local sheep producers. Forbes High would like to thank the Noakes, Dunkley and Kirk families for their support and donations this year. As well as Jason Hoey of Advanced Animal Nutrition for the donation of mineral supplement. To have the 2 top teams at the show is a credit to the stock and producers of the nutritional supplement provided by Advanced animal Nutrition.



#### LACHLAN ENGAGEMENT AND ENRICHMENT PROGRAM


