Students participated in their first practical assessment this week which assessed the ability to perform precision cuts such as Julienne carrots, brunoise onion (diced onion) chopped parsley and crushed garlic. The fine matchstick sized Julienne carrots definitely posed a challenge to the students hand eye coordination cutting a carrot down to a stack of 40mm long by 3mm deep x 3mm wide lengths.

#### TELL THEM FROM ME STUDENT SURVEY

We are delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the **Tell Them From Me** student feedback survey. The survey aims to help improve student learning outcomes and measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a **Tell Them From Me** student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.
