The school recently commemorated Remembrance Day with a ceremony held in our hall. This ceremony was organised by our Head Teacher English/History Mr McKee, as part of the ceremony he invited two members of the Forbes Sub-Branch of RSL, Mr Michael Walker and Mr Allan Bauman to oversee proceedings. Our Student leadership team and the modern history class did a sterling effort during the assembly with numerous readings relevant to the event and a rousing rendition of the National Anthem sung by the students in their relevant houses. The following day I again had the honour of escorting our School Captains and Vice Captains down to Victoria Park for the town ceremony at 11.00am. I invite all students to take these opportunities to broaden their horizons and grow as individuals. It's a BIG world out there!!




MADD NIGHT- A NIGHT FILLED WITH MUSIC, ART, DANCE & DRAMA!

During Week Six (20th November -25th November, this week) we plan to retest our junior students to determine if any improvement is made to their previous results. This retest will also include year six students from our contributing schools as this will assist our teachers to gain a better understanding of their learning needs. All students will sit these exams in either their regular English or Mathematics classes to minimise disruption. In addition The Australian Centre for Educational Research (ACER) has invited our school to participate in the trialling of their new vocabulary test. This will be applied to students in years 7 to 11 in week 7 (27th November to the 1st December). Raw results will be made available. PAT RETEST AND VOCAULARY TRIAL 2017

In Term 2 we tested all junior students at Forbes High School with ACER's Progressive Achievement Test (PAT) to gather data to inform how best to teach our students. This included a 45 minute test on reading and mathematics. We used the data gathered and combined with other data sources such as NAPLAN Smart Data and informal classroom assessment, placed students in similar ability groups to focus on literacy.

Along with vice captains and Relieving Principal Mr. Nottingham, Forbes High School are honoured to continue to be a part of such a special day in our community.





Practical Support for Higher School Certificate Examinations Information for Students and Parents

The Board of Studies has a program to help students with practical support in their Higher School Certificate examinations. This practical support, known as provisions, assists students to read examination questions and to write their answers. Provisions include rest breaks and extra time. The use of any provision is not written on the student's results.

Students may need provisions for:

- a permanent condition, such as diabetes or reading difficulty
- a temporary condition, such as a broken arm, or
- an intermittent condition, such as back pain when sitting for long periods.

It is not embarrassing to apply for or use provisions. More than 5000 HSC students apply for provisions each year. Provisions help students to show the markers what they know and can do.

To apply for provisions, the school submits an online application to the Board of Studies. This application tells us which provisions the student is requesting and includes recent evidence. Evidence may include medical reports, reading results, spelling results, writing samples and teacher comments.

Much of the evidence can be collected by the school, but the parents' role is welcome and needed. Parents help by talking with the school, describing the student's needs, and providing the school with medical or other reports.

Applications for provisions should be submitted by the school to the Board of Studies by the end of Term 1. Late applications are accepted for an emergency, such as a broken arm, until the time of the examinations.

Once the Board of Studies has made a decision about which provisions are approved or declined, a decision letter is provided to the school. The school will provide the student with a copy of the letter.

If you or the school are not satisfied with the Board's decision, it is possible for the school to lodge an appeal. Appeals must state why the Board's decision is unsuitable and must include new evidence to support the appeal.

If you think that you or your child may require support in completing the Higher School Certificate examinations, please discuss the matter with the Year Adviser, School Counsellor or teacher.

HELPING LEARNER DRIVERS BECOME SAFER DRIVERS FREE TWO HOUR WORKSHOP FOR FORBES
