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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Integrated Sport

In 2019 Forbes High School will move to integrated sport. That means, we will no longer have sport on Wednesday afternoon. We know this move will enable students to access expert coaching and build their skills in a variety of sports.

Timetable – Wednesday Change
