PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Year 12 HSC Examinations

The Higher School Certificate has officially come to conclusion this year and some of our Year 12 students have successfully gained Early Entry offers to University. Other students have sought fulltime work and some others are considering alternative options. At the end of this week, we will participate in our final Year 12 school event 'Year 12 Graduation Dinner'; major awards will be presented to students with portfolios highlighting the successful completion of their secondary education.

Wellness Hub Parent survey

Our school is currently engaging with researchers from the NSW Department of Education Learning and Wellbeing Directorate. They are tasked with evaluating the effectiveness of our Wellness Hub and its impact on student wellbeing and learning outcomes. The external team acknowledge that we are by far the most progressive Wellness Hub in the state and many other schools look to us to establish similar assets and resources in other schools. Forbes Community White Ribbon March
