ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES

As part of the school attendance procedures, Year Advisers will be making contact with families to follow up on students who have been identified with decreasing attendance. Students who have been identified with improving attendance have also been identified and contact by Year Advisers will also be made.

ASSESSMENT

Year 11 students have been issued with their HSC 2022-2023 Assessment booklet. If I could ask that all students, parents and carers familiarise themselves with assessment procedures and assessment schedules for their student's subjects.


BOYS TO THE BUSH TERM 4 PROGRAM - WEEK 2 SUMMARY








Sandbagging and prepping for Flood



40km/h school zones

40km/h school zones slow traffic on the roads around schools. This is to help protect children on their way to and from schools at the times and places where they are often in high numbers. Most 40km/h school zones operate between 800m and 9,30m and from 2,30m until 4,00pm. The 40km/h school zone speed limit must be observed even if school children cannot be seen.

A 40km/h school zone operates on all notified school days including staff development days (student-free days). While some schools may operate on different term dates, school zone speed limits must be followed during NSW Government determined school terms.

To increase motorists' awareness of 40km/h school zones, triangular 'dragon's teeth' road markings indicate that the vehicle is entering a school zone.

Fines and a loss of demerit points will apply if the 40 km/h speed limit isn't followed. For more information on fines and demerit points, visit rms.nsw.gov.au
