The results were promising with strong bubbles created. Do you know the secret ingredient? The answer is very sweet.









Year 7 Digital Technologies are developing their coding skills in preparation to create their Lego Mindstorms Robots by the end of term.


Students will develop their understanding of how colour sensors, ultrasonic sensors and understand the motors used withing the robotic systems.


