JAKE TOMLINSON YEAR 8 EXCELS AT NORTH WEST EQUESTRIAN EXPO

Approximately 600 students attend North West Equestrian Expo at Coonabarabran for 5 days. Jake competed in the One Day Event (ODE) dressage, showjumping and cross country jumping. After dressage Jake was placed 13th. He then did his showjumping and cross country jumping to be placed 4th overall.



Jake also competed in the Junior (12 years to 15 years) Boys Pentathlon. This event you had to run 2.4kms, throw a javelin, showjumping, weave jump and a mountain bike ride which was cancelled due to the weather. Jake won the run and showjumping leg, came 6th in the javelin and 4th in the weave jump to give Jake a total 50 points to finish 1st overall.



Jake competed with RBCC in a six bar team with 4 other riders - Jemma Hodder, Freya Hooper and Tess Worland. The Six-bar event is where riders jump six fences set in a straight line. In most places, fences are placed at equal distances apart, the first fence is the lowest and each subsequent fence is higher than the one before. There are 5 rounds. Jake got to the 4th round before he knock the last jump at 120cm high. The team did an excellent job to finish 6th overall.



Team penning is a team sport in which there are three members and the objective is to separate three specific type of identifiable cattle from a herd of 30. The sport is fast-paced, in which the riders, after separating the cattle, also have to move them inside of a 16' x 24' pen through a small 10' opening. The pen is located at the opposite end of the arena. The sport requires complete teamwork to successfully identify and cut out the right cattle, move them back to the pen, and prevent the other cattle from straying in 90 seconds. Jake competed with Ella Breen from Canowindra and Will Poole from Dubbo in two rounds. In round 1 they penned 2 cows and round 2 they penned all three cows. They were the only team to pen 5 cows to finish 1st overall.



Showjumping: Jake competed in the 115cm Astronomical Class. There were 2 rounds and Jake won the 1st round. The second round was run as a Grand Prix. It was 115cm high and then the jumps went up to 125cm. Jake dropped one rail to finish 2nd. Jake was awarded Reserve Champion on a count back.



Jake also played Polo Crosse with RBCC's Imogen Thurgate and Josie Brown to get the the 2nd round before being knocked out by the team that eventually won the division. Jake was asked to play in the finals with another team and that team lost. Jake loved playing polocrosse. Jake also competed in the Warrenbungle Way - a sporting and working horse challenge. Jake had a very successful expo bringing home the 14 Years Boy Champion for the Expo, and won three rugs. Contributed by Jane Tomlinson

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AROUND THE GROUNDS WITH PDHPE

It's been a busy time for the PDHPE faculty of late. Sporting teams, carnivals, assessments, tests and general classwork have kept the PDHPE staff and their students on task. Physical Activity and Sports Studies have been busy developing their knowledge of the body's structures and how they work. The students have learnt the structure and function of the skeletal, muscular, cardiovascular and respiratory systems. Some interesting facts:

- There are 206 bones in an adult human body.
- The gluteus maximus is one of the stongest muscles in the body.
- The heart beats approximately 100,000 times per day.

In Child Studies, child growth and development have been the major focus for the term, looking at stages of growth and milestones that children meet at specific ages. Did you know?

- Babies will usually crawl at between 6 and 13 months.
- Babies generally start walking between 8 and 18 months.
- Most babies being to talk between 12-18 months with 'mum' being the most common first word.









YEAR 11 COMMUNITY AND FAMILY STUDIES

Year 11 CAFS have been studying the module "Individuals & Groups" this term. Part of this module is learning about leadership, the different types, qualities of a good leader and also conflict within groups. Early this term, the class participated in the Spaghetti Challenge. This required them to work in small groups with 20 strands of spaghetti, string, tape and a marshmallow to build the tallest structure. They had 20 minutes and the marshmallow had to be on top at the end. At the conclusion, students discussed who took on the role of the leader in their group and what made them an effective or ineffective leader.



ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

On Friday 27th May Forbes High School held it's annual Athletics carnival. The sun was shining and students and staff were keen for a fun filled and competitive day. 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Do You Know What They Are Vaping ?

We are Encouraging Parents and Carers to find out more and talk about the hidden impacts of vapes with your children. Alarmingly, we are seeing an increase in the number of young people trying vaping.

Young people may think they are simply inhaling flavoured water, this is far from the truth. Vapes can have the same harmful chemicals found in cleaning products, nail polish remover, weed killer and bug spray.

Vapes are colourful, with flavours that make them appealing. You wouldn't put cleaning products in your food, so why would you want to put it into your lungs?

What you can do as a parent or carer

There are ways you can help protect your children from vaping: Whether you suspect your child is vaping or not, take the time to talk to them about it and help them understand all of the risks. It is never too late to have the conversation.

- Try to start the conversation with your child in a relaxed easy-going way, perhaps taking the cue from around you, such as a note from school, a news story about on it, or seeing people vaping on the street.
- If your child is vaping, encourage them to stop, let them know that help is available and you are there for them.
- Learn about the different types of vapes available and the risks associated with using these products.
- Set a good example by being tobacco or vape free.
- Report those who are selling vapes to minors or selling vapes containing nicotine by completing the online reporting form or calling the Tobacco Information Line on 1800 357 412.
