DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

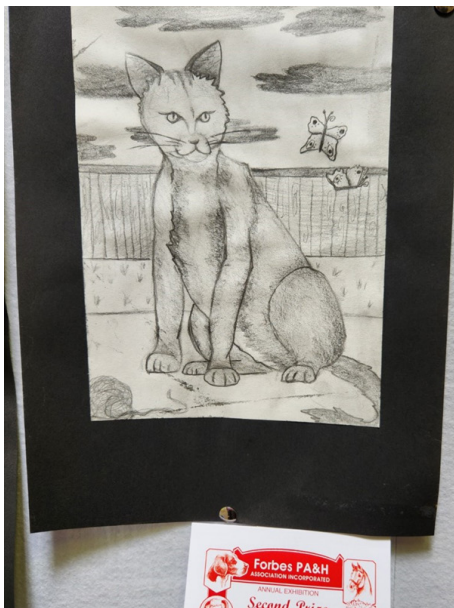
It is hard to believe that we have reached the end of another term and the end of formal schooling for our 2022 Year 12 students.

I hope you all have a happy safe and relaxing break and look forward to seeing everyone back at school for the start of Term 4.

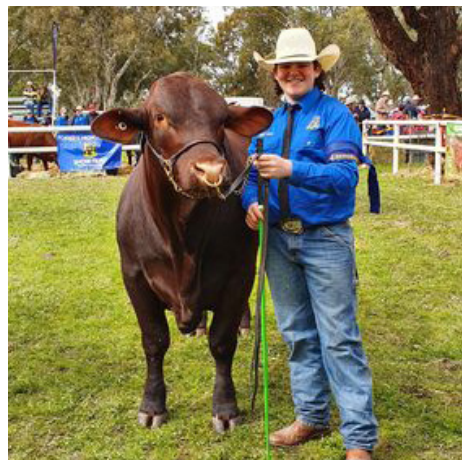

AGRICULTURE

The Show Team has had record participation this year with both stage 4 and 5 teams at capacity. The Dubbo Merino Wether Challenge was a great success with our team winning overall champion carcase value, and coming second overall, which was an amazing achievement in a competition comprised of 65 schools and 124 wether teams.



The local shows have also kept the students busy, with 5 stud heifers from our local regions arriving to be halter trained and prepared for the local shows. Bedgerabong was a success, with our wether team winning top team and individual wether, and our heifers presented very well, considering it was their first show. Jack Kemp won the Opens Paraders competition and we had multiple finalists in the Junior Judging.

Forbes Show then was a great success with our team presenting 13 Dairy Heifers, which was a massive achievement for the team and Ms Eagles. Achieving champion Dairy heifer, and our students achieving many prizes including Eli Brown -1st 8-13 years paraders, Georgia Cole 3rd in 14-18 years. Jess Tudgey achieved 2nd in the Junior Judging and qualifying for Sydney Royal Judging.

Saturday was beef judging, with our Limousine heifer achieving Champion European heifer and our Hereford winning reserve champion British Breed heifer. The heifers also gave Mr Byrne a run for his money, and we were all happy to get home safely that afternoon...



WELLBEING NEWS

On Thursday's, we have female students from year 7 attending drumbeat. Sue Larkings is a facilitator in Drumbeat and runs the program with our Student Support Officer, Abbey Swain. What is D.R.U.M.B.E.A.T (Discovering Relationships Using Music, Beliefs, Emotions, Attitudes and Thoughts). The course is structured but flexible and is delivered over ten weeks.

On Friday's Catholic Care workers, Renae Herbert, Rebecca Palenapa-Pili and Michael Brown, ran a five-week group workshop on Healthy Relationships with male students from year 10 and female students from year 8. The purpose of the group is to empower the students with the knowledge to be aware of their own behaviours and how it could be impacting on others, as well as how to recognise they are in an unhealthy relationship and how to seek help. We will be running this group again term 4, with females from year 10 and males from year 8. If you would like your child to be apart of this, please contact the school.

A stress management workshop was delivered to our year 12 students after the completion of their trial examinations to provide them with the skills and knowledge to manage stress and difficulties for their final exams. In week 9, a healthy friendships workshop was delivered to females students from year 8. The purpose of the workshop was to provide the students with the skills and information needed to navigate friendships through their adolescence years. The workshop focussed on boundaries, social media, miscommunication, being kind, self-awareness, and the signs that a friendship may be unhealthy.

Thank you to the Youth Wellness Committee and the SRC for supporting the R U OK Day fundraising cake stall. The cake stall raised \$109.50 for the R U OK Day charity. The aim of R U OK? Day is to engage Australians to connect with people in the community they may have concerns about, encouraging them to seek further help and to follow up to ensure support is being provided. Please contact the school and ask to speak with Abbey, if you would like support for your child.



On Thursday's at lunch time, the school is running an LGBTQIA+ group, this is for students who identify as part of the community, those questioning their identity or sexuality, and allies of the community to show their support for the group. This is to provide a safe environment for these students where they can openly talk about their experiences.

The youth wellness committee has commenced again term 3. Our students from year 9 and up are invited to participate. The committee focusses on wellbeing promotional activities that affect themselves and their peers. Students attend meetings every Tuesday during their lunch break to work on projects that require research, and creative promotional material concerning wellbeing.



Meals on Wheels

Forbes High School has recommenced their partnership with Forbes Meals on Wheels. Twice a term on a Monday, year 8 students have the opportunity to volunteer and deliver Meals to the most vulnerable citizens of our community with Student Support Officer, Abbey.



WELLBEING CONTINUED -

In term 4, there will be a group, Small Steps to Success for our year 9 and 10 female students. The purpose of the group is to provide education and interventions to help the students develop their sense of identity, body image, self-esteem, healthy eating habits and social media influences. This will be run by Abbey, SSO and Rural Youth Mental Health worker, Melanie Cowhan. Another group will be the Brilliant Boys group with male students from year 7, the focus of this group is to improve the student's resilience and ability to manage and control their emotions, this will be run by Abbey, SSO and Barry Merritt, Aboriginal Education Officer. RAGE, is going to be run in the last half of term 4 with some of our male students from the support unit. This group provides an honest and open space to talk about anger and healthy ways to express anger. RAGE stands for renegotiating angry and guilty emotions. This will be run by trained facilitators, SSO, Abbey Swain and Catholic Care worker, Colin Cartwright.

STATE ATHLETICS

Jess Tudgey, Alex Lemon, Eamonn Ryan, Will Bailey and Philip Klinger went away to Homebush, Sydney on the 8th and 9th of September for the NSWCHSSA State Athletics championships. The boys travelled to compete in the 4 x 100m relay, along with Jess who competed in the u16 girls shotput. The boys trained during lunch and recess times throughout the term to improve their baton changes and communication skills. They were placed in a competitive field however, made a great effort to finish 7th place in their heat. Jess spent a lot of her spare time during recess time and at home practicing shot put before travelling to Homebush. She was placed in a tough field of 19 however, threw a great throw of 9.68m, which was close to her PB.



LONG TAN BURSARY

Applications have opened for next year's Long Tan Bursary. This bursary pays for the tertiary education of children and grandchildren of Vietnam Veterans.

Each year 37 bursaries are awarded to successful applicants across Australia. Each bursary is worth up to \$12,000 and provided over three years for continuous full-time study.

The Long Tan Bursary scheme is named after the Battle of Long Tan, the widely-known battle fought by Australians during the Vietnam War. It saw 18 Australians killed and 25 wounded.

Vietnam veterans were instrumental in setting up the Long Tan Bursary, which was funded by the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) and administered by the Australian Veterans' children Assistance Trust (AVCAT). It offers various scholarships to children and grandchildren of Vietnam Veterans.

Forbes CanAssist provides financial assistance to local cancer patients and their families for costs associated with the disease including travel, accommodation, medicines, treatment as well as household expenses due to loss of regular income. CanAssist does not receive government assistance and relies heavily on the generosity of the Forbes community with fundraising activities and events.

Forbes CanAssist is well supported by members, volunteers and the community of Forbes as all money raised and donated is used to assist Forbes and district cancer patients.

The Event raffle was drawn on the night, was well supported by local businesses who generously donated all five of the prizes. First prize was a \$300 gift voucher donated by Tim Woods at Outback soils was won by Abbey Bryant, Second prize a Garden Parcel donated by Bunnings Warehouse went to Keith Clarke. 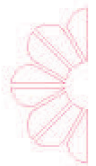

- Your application will be assessed on your written personal statement, Year 11 results, school's ratings of your aptitudes and performance in relevant areas of study.
- If your application is successful, you will receive an early conditional offer with an ATAR entry requirement significantly lower than the advertised Lowest Selection Rank.
- Then, if your ATAR result is the same or higher than the entry requirement set for you in your early conditional offer, you will receive a firm offer to that UNSW degree, if it is your highest eligible preference.

When you enrol to UNSW through the Gateway Admission Pathway, you will be prioritised for UNSW Equity and Accommodation scholarships and receive exclusive access to academic and transition support.

THE TELL THEM FROM ME STUDENT SURVEY (TERM 3, 2022)
