We have had a very busy and rewarding two weeks at Forbes High.

I would like to particularly congratulate my year 11 hospitality class, who excelled themselves in producing and serving an exquisite two-course menu for our visitors. R U OK? Day has been developed inspire and empower everyone to meaningfully connect with the people around them and start a conversation with those in their world who may be struggling with life.

















BEN BARNARD - OUTDOOR SETTING AND FIRE PIT

Benjamin's major project consisted in three. Benjamin created a fire pit constructed from recycled plough discs and a laser cut base detailing aspects of the farm he has grown up on. This project also consisted of an outdoor setting which included two curved flat pack seats. The development of his gravity defying "floating" Tensegrity serving table proved to be a challenging concept to master. A combination of timber and metal working skills has been used to produce this project with a large focus on Benjamin developing his metal fabrication skills.







JAKE SMITH - FLAT PACK DOUBLE BED

Jake's major project focussed on creating a flat pack double bed to assist with transportation. Jake utilised a wide range of machining and sheet metal fabrication to develop his design. Jake was also able to powder coat his own project at MD Steel due to connections he made by working with them part time in earlier years. Jake's design allowed for a comfortable bed which combined intricate curves to develop its modern features.







CASSIDY ROBB-POTTS - SADDLE STAND

Cassidy created saddle stand to assist her with storage of her saddles and horse-riding implements. Cassidy's work allowed this piece to come together with design choices from her current work background and her passion for horses.






TYLER BEAUMONT - ROCKING CHAIR









EMMA HERFORD - OUTDOOR CHAIRS AND DRINKS TABLE







- Then, if your ATAR result is the same or higher than the entry requirement set for you in your early conditional offer, you will receive a firm offer to that UNSW degree, if it is your highest eligible preference.

THE TELL THEM FROM ME STUDENT SURVEY (TERM 3, 2022)

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a Tell Them From Me student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used Tell Them From Me to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 12 September and 4 November. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.
