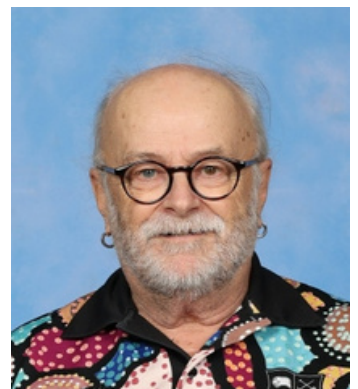
Mrs Jessica Smith

Restricted social networking platforms for students

From Day 1 Term 4, students will no longer be able to use their school email address (@education.nsw.gov.au) to access social media, gaming, instant messaging and similar platforms. This means they will also not be able to retrieve password-recovery emails and the like from these platforms.

The NSW Department of Education is making this important change to help keep our students safe online, reduce the risk of cyber threats and make sure student email accounts are used for their intended educational purposes only.

If students have signed up for a social media, gaming, instant messaging or similar account using their student email address, please change to a personal email address on each platform by Sunday 13 October 2024 to make sure you don't lose access to the account.

Here's how:

1. Log in to each account.
2. Go to the account settings and update your email address to a personal one. Add a mobile number too, if you haven't already.

The department is making this change to ensure all student accounts are being used for their educational purposes, and to help protect them from risks online. Using a personal email address for these platforms instead of their student email address reduces the chances of someone gaining access to information in their school account.

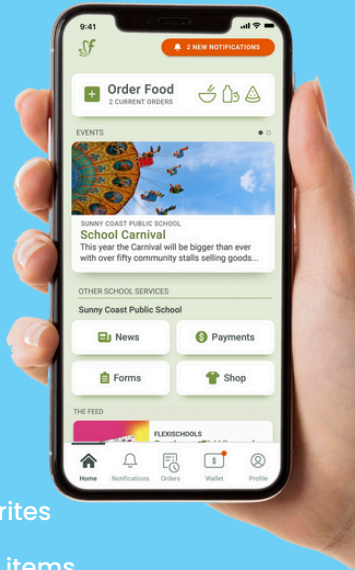

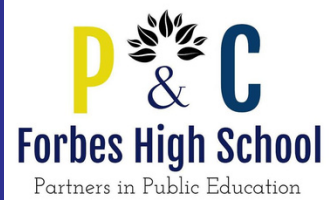
