One of the largest pressing issues that many students face today surrounds their resilience to bounce back from the obstacles that they face daily. Some of these are minute and pose no real problems, however, others can be a real barrier to success for our students. Forbes High is making great inroads into teaching the skills and strategies that our students can use to overcome these obstacles through a multitude of programs being put in place. The Resilience Project will be rolled out across all years as of next term to assist in this. The lessons in The Resilience Project curriculum are focused on four evidence based positive mental health strategies:

- 1. Gratitude:** Paying attention to the things that we have right now, and not worrying about the things that we don't have.
- 2. Empathy:** Putting ourselves in the shoes of others to feel and see as they do.
- 3. Mindfulness:** Intentional awareness generated by remembering to pay attention to the whole of your experience while differentiating that which is helpful verses unhelpful for you.
- 4. Emotional Literacy:** The ability to recognise/label our emotions and therefore manage our emotions as we experience them throughout our daily lives.

We look forward to implementing this program throughout the year to help support our students.

The Resilience Project is committed to teaching positive mental health strategies to prevent mental ill-health and build young people's capacity to deal with adversity.

We will be implementing their evidence-based Teaching and Learning Program throughout our classrooms, staffroom and school community.

Teachers and students will engage in weekly lessons and activities around the key principles of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness (GEM) and Emotional Literacy to build resilience.

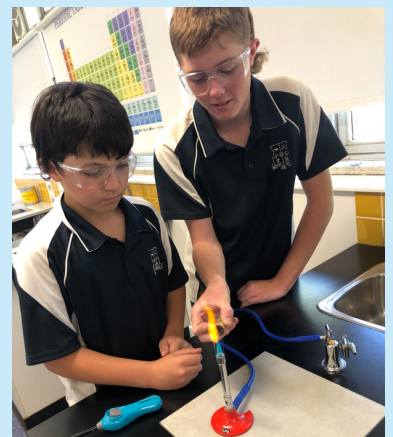

### Year 12 Drama – OnStage Excursion

On Wednesday 14th Feb, our Year 12 Drama class accompanied by Mrs Smith and Ms Emmett travelled to Sydney to find inspiration for their HSC Drama Course.

Thursday started with a backstage tour of Bell Shakespeare, where our students got to discuss their Individual Projects with two professional costume designers. Even our students not doing costume design for their projects were able to

discuss their costumes for their monologue performances. Our students also got to see a sneak peak of the costumes for Bell Shakespeare's travelling performance of a Midsummer Night's Dream. Thank you to Bell Shakespeare for hosting us!

We then walked through circular quay to the Opera House, looking at some of their promotional designs before we explored the botanical gardens and found ourselves at the Art Gallery of NSW where exhibition ArtExpress is held. ArtExpress is the HSC Art Exhibition of band 6 projects and as we had an art student with us, we couldn't miss the opportunity to explore the gallery.

After lunch, we found our way to the Seymour Centre where students participated in a HSC Group Devising Workshop with Little Eggs Collective – an award winning theatre devising company. HSC drama students will start devising an original piece of theatre as a group next term to be performed as a part of their HSC assessment. This workshop provided them with the skills to succeed and make some great friendships with Drama students from other schools.

On Thursday evening, our students attended OnStage which includes a gallery exhibition of HSC Band 6 Individual Projects. In 2023, Year 12 Drama Student, Claudia had been nominated to have her Costume Design displayed at OnStage, but was not in the final selection. She has set the bar high for this cohort. After watching the show which included group performances, individual performances, a moved reading of a student written script and a video drama, our students have been inspired. The walk home involved an engaging discussion on our thoughts on the pieces displayed at OnStage.

On the return home, enjoying the time to read the books they brought with them and further discuss their last trip to Sydney for Drama.

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) to provide free home internet for up to 30,000 unconnected families with school aged students until the end of December, 2025.

To be eligible for SSBI, families must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including Prep in Qld/Vic/Tas, Kindy in NSW, Reception in SA, Transition in NT/ACT and Pre-Primary in WA).
- Not have an active nbn® network internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.
- Live in a premises that can access the nbn network via a standard connection.
- Not have had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days.

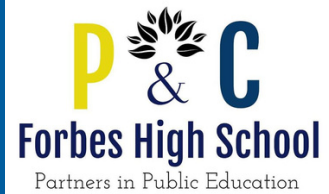
