#### Behaviour code for students

#### Information for students and parents or carers

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students.

#### In NSW public schools students are expected, to the best of their ability, to:

- show respect to other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- · strive for the highest standards in learning
- act in a courteous and respectful way that makes all members of the school community feel valued, included and supported
- · resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code
- attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- respect all property
- be safe and not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, vapes, e-cigarettes or tobacco into our schools
- not bully, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against anyone in our schools.

Schools take action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high-quality teaching and learning.

#### All students have a right to:

- safety at school
- access and fully participate in their learning
- be treated with respect by other students, teachers and school staff
- express their views, set goals and selfadvocate.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments and apply an appropriate action when students are not meeting these expectations. The department is responsible for the provision of a policy framework and resources such as legal issues bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context, the NSW

Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

#### Behaviour code for students: Student actions

Promoting the inclusion, learning, wellbeing, and safety of all students in NSW public schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches across a range of settings to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

To meet the expectations set out above, students in NSW public schools, to the best of their ability, should adhere to the following principles.

#### Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- Communicate and behave courteously.
- Act and work cooperatively with other students, teachers, and school staff.
- Develop positive and respectful relationships.
- · Value the interests, ability and culture of others.
- Respect the learning needs of other students.
- Dress appropriately by wearing the agreed school uniform or dress code.
- Take care with school property and the property of staff and other students.

#### Safety

- Model and follow school and class rules and expectations around behaviour and conduct.
- Negotiate and resolve conflict.
- Be aware of and take responsibility for how their behaviour and actions impact others.
- · Care for self and others.
- Be safe and help others to make safe choices that do not hurt themselves or others.

#### Engagement

- · Arrive at school and class on time.
- Be prepared for every lesson.
- Actively participate in learning.
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning.



#### **Anthem for Doomed Youth**

by Wilfred Owen

What passing-bells for these who die as cattle?
Only the monstrous anger of the guns.
Only the stuttering rifles' rapid rattle
Can patter out their hasty orisons.
No mockeries now for them; no prayers nor bells;
Nor any voice of mourning save the choirs,
The shrill, demented choirs of wailing shells;
And bugles calling for them from sad shires.

What candles may be held to speed them all? Not in the hands of boys, but in their eyes Shall shine the holy glimmers of good-byes. The pallor of girls' brows shall be their pall; Their flowers the tenderness of patient minds, And each slow dusk a drawing-down of blinds.



Year English are immersing themselves in WWI, both in English and History. They have been reading Wilfred poetry by Owen discussing the futility of war and the different ways soldiers conveyed their feelings during this time. They have been engaging in a creative activity where they have been tasked with developing a portfolio of artifacts that tie in with their analysis and understanding of Owen's poem, 'Anthem for Doomed Youth.'

The facts they have learnt in History have allowed them to utilise real life battles and events to evolve their soldier personas and create some truly heartbreaking narratives

In 1917, Wilfred Owen penned
'Anthem for Doomed Youth,' a
poem that mourns the sacrifice of
young lives during World War I and
vividly portrays the brutal realities
of warfare. The poem revolves
around the theme of the
devastating impact of war.

#### **HSIE**

#### Geography

Throughout their study of Earth's Natural Systems Year 11 Geography have been engaging in onsite and offsite fieldwork to explore the processes and circulation that contribute to land cover change. They explored the water cycle by observing clouds and weather processes across the school and engaged in fieldwork activities by collecting observations and field sketches.



As part of their assessment, Year 11 Geography explored the processes contributing to erosion at Cottons Weir and evaluated the severity of human impacts and natural threats to the Lachlan River.

#### 6. System inclusion


Inclusion is embedded across all parts of our system in culture, policies and everyday practices.
