
EUGOWRA NAIDOC






Mathematics

This term in Mathematics a small group of students from Year 7 have formed an enrichment group which meet once a week to be extended. They have studied algebraic fractions and are now studying the Cartesian Plane. The students have learned to plot points and created tables on the DESMOS graphing calculator, creating simple designs. They will soon venture into using linear and non-linear relationships to create a more difficult design of their choice.
















Students in Years 7 and 8 have chosen their own language to learn in Term 2. Students are learning – Italian, Japanese, French, German, Spanish and Chinese. Students use Education Perfect to learn their language and can access this at home. In addition to learning their language students have created a poster on the main country their language is spoken.

Learning and Support

In Learning and Support students are continuing the reading program with Mrs Bolam and the MultiLit program with Mrs Neilsen. Students have started a new program for numeracy called QuickSmart with Miss Maddy Dukes. QuickSmart is a program that focuses on developing basic numeracy skills in students and involves games, computer testing and flashcards.

'LEARNING AND SUPPORT TEACHER' – REPORT FOR TERM TWO 2024

Forbes High School strongly supports the acquisition of reading skills. Students attending Forbes High School in 2023 in Year 10, all independent readers, could all pass their Minimum Standards Reading Test, unlike many of their NSW cohort. We are proud of all students genuinely giving their best effort.



What are the stages in reading for students?

<u>Dependent:</u> dependent on others (SLSO etc) to read for them and with them <u>Less dependent:</u> needing an SLSO (Student Learning Support Officer) for help <u>Nearly functional:</u> still needs some help from a teacher, classmate, or SLSO <u>Functional:</u> able to read a newspaper except for technical words/ place names <u>Highly functional:</u> learns new words easily in class, needs help only occasionally <u>Independent:</u> confident re all reading required in class, and researches well <u>Absolutely marvellous:</u> very well skilled in decoding words for all purposes <u>Amazing:</u> an exceptional decoder of words, loves knowing meanings, usage

Year 7 students and new students who are not already independent readers when they come to Forbes High School, are included in the Reading Improvement Program. All are individually and systematically taught to decode words (how to work words out by learning: how syllables work, the rules applying to vowels, specific letter combinations, etc.) Gaining effective decoding skills improves mastery of all school subjects, and everyday reading.

Each student spends 20 to 30 minutes each week with me, individually learning the new skills they personally need. This method is known as distributive practice, highly recommended as the optimum reading instruction method, promoted and detailed online for many years by Professor Rauno Parrila, at Sydney's Macquarie University, now in Melbourne. It allows valuable time to practise the skills learnt each day, before each next new lesson.

You are always welcome to discuss your student's reading by ringing the front office to make an appointment to meet with me. Many thanks to parents who send notes; and who value attendance, learning, friendliness and respect.

Science

Year 7

This term year 7 have looked into living things. They have explored the idea of what makes something a living organism before delving into the world of cells. To aid with this they have looked at the cells of living things and various other specimens under the microscope. Moving on from cells, year 7 have looked at how plants carry water, specifically looking at the cells within celery.

Year 8

Did you know the skin is the biggest organ in the body or that the heart pumps around 5.5 Litres of blood a minute? This is the type of information year 8 have learnt this term in their Biology topic. Year 8 have covered the body systems, learning about their role in keeping us alive. While conducting this topic, they have been lucky enough to participate in a range of dissections, including chicken wings (muscles and skeletal systems), heart (circulatory system) and kidney (excretory system).





Year 9

This term year 9 have been looking at physics. They started the term by exploring heat transfer, and learning about how heat moves through the methods of conduction, convection, and radiation. After heat transfer, students have been learning about waves and light. To do this, students have undertaken a range of experiments to investigate the properties of waves.



Year 10



Year 10 have engaged with their biology topic this term. They started the term looking into the reproductive system before moving onto the structure of DNA. Students where lucky enough to investigate this by using lollies to create their own DNA model.

In the back half of the term, year 10 have been learning about the science of inheritance and genetics. To do this, they have investigated how we use both punnet squares and pedigrees to both track and predict inheritance patterns.



Agriculture

Showteam has been active with the preparation of merino wethers for the NSW Merino Wether competition with halter training and weekly weighing of the wethers. Their first competition next term will be Bedgerabong Show, before heading to Dubbo. Term 2 has been busy down the ag farm with Year 11 and 12 Primary Industries starting to install the new water troughs, fencing and sowing crops.











9/10 Agriculture have studied Prime Lambs and Poultry. Raising day old Isa Brown chicks and feed lotting lambs.

Students participated in the Bedgerabong Pig Education day in May learning how to wash, parade, judge and auctioneer pigs. Our students did an amazing job with Noah placing 3rd in the pig judging.









Eugowra Young Judges Educational Day in June. Students attended workshops in the morning sessions, then taking their learnt skills and knowledge to compete in Junior Judging after lunch.

The following students placed in: Grains - 1st Eli Brown Poultry - 1st Isaac Knight Fleece - 1st Lilly Eagles Meat sheep - 1st Eli Brown , 2nd Isaac Knight and 3rd Amelia Behan

We look forward to a very busy show season with sheep, beef cattle, dairy cattle and junior judging.

The ag farm will have a small amount of Isa Brown pullets (15 weeks old) available at the start of term 3. Contact Ms Eagles for more information.

Behaviour code for students

Information for students and parents or carers

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected, to the best of their ability, to:

- show respect to other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- strive for the highest standards in learning
- act in a courteous and respectful way that makes all members of the school community feel valued, included and supported
- resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code
- attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- respect all property
- be safe and not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, vapes, e-cigarettes or tobacco into our schools
- not bully, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against anyone in our schools.

Schools take action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high-quality teaching and learning.

All students have a right to:

- safety at school
- access and fully participate in their learning
- be treated with respect by other students, teachers and school staff
- express their views, set goals and selfadvocate.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments and apply an appropriate action when students are not meeting these expectations. The department is responsible for the provision of a policy framework and resources such as legal issues bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context, the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

Behaviour code for students: Student actions

Promoting the inclusion, learning, wellbeing, and safety of all students in NSW public schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches across a range of settings to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

To meet the expectations set out above, students in NSW public schools, to the best of their ability, should adhere to the following principles.

- Communicate and behave courteously.
- Act and work cooperatively with other students, teachers, and school staff.

- Take care with school property and the property of staff and other students.

Safety

- Model and follow school and class rules and expectations around behaviour and conduct.
- Negotiate and resolve conflict.
- Be aware of and take responsibility for how their behaviour and actions impact others.
- · Care for self and others.
- Be safe and help others to make safe choices that do not hurt themselves or others.

Engagement

- Arrive at school and class on time.
- Be prepared for every lesson.
- Actively participate in learning.
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning.


