Forbes High's quest for **Sydney Royal success**

champion quietly growing beneath the green vines of this veggie patch?

From tiny Jack Be Littles to Atlantic Giants that require a team effort to lift, Forbes High School's agriculture students have been perfecting their pumpkin-growing prowess for

With a mix of science, dedication, and a whole lot of horse manure (literally), they're aiming for even bigger wins at the 2025 Sydney Royal Easter Show.

In 2024 they sent more than 200 pumpkins off to the Show, the Atlantic giants for competition and five different varieties for the Western District Exhib-

"Last year we placed second in the school section for giant pumpkins and won the open under 50 kg giant pumpkin," teacher Rachel Eagles said.

Working with Stuart Muller to source seed, they're fine

Is Forbes' next Sydney Royal tuning their growing process every year, starting with wellprepared soils.

> They heavily fertilise with organic horse manure prior to planting, pinch the vines as the pumpkins form so only a couple grow to maturity, and fertilise regularly.

The chosen giant pumpkins are under drip irrigation and carefully placed on plastic pallets - with thanks to the community who provided those this year - and covered with shades once they get big.

When they're ready for harvest, they'll be carefully removed from the pumpkin patch with a sling, because they're already probably more than 60kg.

And while the size is critical, it's not all about the size.

"You want it to have a nice uniform shape, a nice colour," Mrs Eagles said - and picking it at just the right point is critical

But pumpkins aren't their only claim to fame - these students are also raising champion hens to lay award-worthy

The school is part of the school's egg-laying challenge for Sydney Royal, taking delivery of six Hyline pullets that they have been raising up and handling.

Come Show-time they'll select the best three to take to Sydney where they'll settle in and lay their eggs judging over a number of days. If you're looking for eggs, Forbes High students do collect, clean and stamp the eggs from their regular layers.

School Student Travel



School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. Note: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.

Behaviour code for students

Information for students and parents or carers

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected, to the best of their ability, to:

- show respect to other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- strive for the highest standards in learning
- act in a courteous and respectful way that makes all members of the school community feel valued, included and supported
- · resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code
- attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- respect all property
- be safe and not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, vapes, e-cigarettes or tobacco into our schools
- not bully, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against anyone in our schools.

Schools take action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high-quality teaching and learning.

All students have a right to:

- safety at school
- access and fully participate in their learning
- be treated with respect by other students, teachers and school staff
- express their views, set goals and selfadvocate.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments and apply an appropriate action when students are not meeting these expectations. The department is responsible for the provision of a policy framework and resources such as legal issues bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context, the NSW

Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

Behaviour code for students: Student actions

Promoting the inclusion, learning, wellbeing, and safety of all students in NSW public schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches across a range of settings to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

To meet the expectations set out above, students in NSW public schools, to the best of their ability, should adhere to the following principles.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- Communicate and behave courteously.
- Act and work cooperatively with other students, teachers, and school staff.
- Develop positive and respectful relationships.
- · Value the interests, ability and culture of others.
- Respect the learning needs of other students.
- Dress appropriately by wearing the agreed school uniform or dress code.
- Take care with school property and the property of staff and other students.

Safety


- Model and follow school and class rules and expectations around behaviour and conduct.






