- Handles correspondence and manages documentation for the committee.

4. Treasurer

- Manages the financial affairs of the committee, including budgets, banking, and financial reports.
- Ensures compliance with financial policies and procedures.
- Computer skills essential

5. Fundraising Coordinator

- Develops and coordinates fundraising activities to support school programs.
- Works with volunteers to plan and execute events.

6. Marketing and Communications Officer

- Manages communication strategies, including social media and P&C items for school newsletters etc.

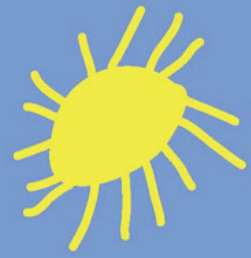

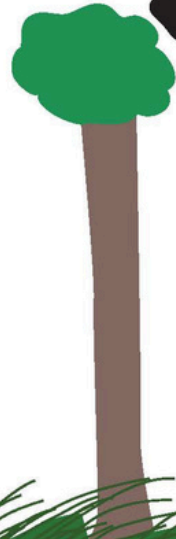
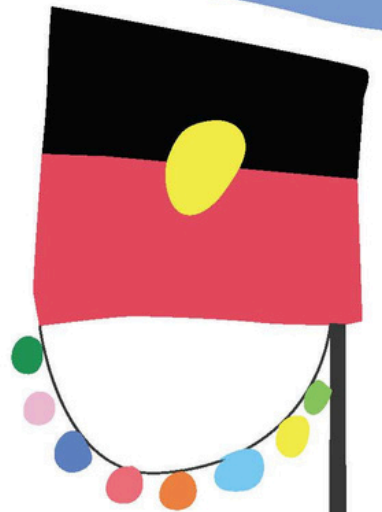
